Clyde Hoey opened an attack on "Ralph McDonald from Illinois," last week during his trip into Eastern Carolina. The Shelby lawyer flayed his opponent with a vigorous defense of the North Carolina Democratic organization, saying, "All that Gilliam Grissom, the Republican nominee for governor needs to do is to take the speech being delivered by McDonald, change a few words and use it during the fall campaign."

Clyde H. Jarrett, lawyer of Andrews, was nominated as Republican candidate for Congress from the eleventh district in Asheville recenty. He was presented to the G. O. P. Convention by his father, R. F. Jarrett, of Jackson county, who has long been an outstanding Republican

Mr. Jarrett was nominated over Hasley B. Leavitt, of Asheville.

The eleventh district Republicans also named Mitchell F. Lominac, of Woodfin, and Walter R. Chambers, of Marion, as delegates to the national convention in Cleveland in June. Horace N. Sentelle, of Canton, and Fred D. Hamrick, of Rutherfordton,

Several weeks ago Congressman Zebulon Weaver announced he was a candidate for re-election to Congress from the eleventh district. Other than Mr. Weaver, no other candidate has announced. There has been some talk of W. B. Fisher, of Asheville and Andrews, state manager of the Townsend Pension Plan opposing Mr. Weaver, Mr. Fisher, however, has made no formal statement.

Mr. Fountain was here recently, making visits around, and getting things in shape for the June primary. Word coming out of Raleigh after his western trip was to the effect that he got but little encouragment in these hills regarding his chances of defeatng the present senior senator,

"Sandy" Graham, candidate for governor is advocating an immediate call for a special session of the General Assembly. It is his opinion that he assembly could transact all busi-

Mr. Graham, however, did not spend all of his time last week talkng about the special session of the General Assembly—not by any means, In Dunn he flayed both his opponents -charging that Hoey had no program, and that Dr. McDonald proposed to do away with one source of taxation now yielding \$10,000,000 a year, and in turn increase state expenses \$10,-000,000, but as yet had failed to disclose where he would find the necessary \$20,000,000
