60 District G. O. P. Leaders Make Plans For Campaign

Candidate Gudger Heard By Republican Executives Here Yesterday

All 13 counties were represented here yesterday afternoon at the district executive committee of the Republican party, and heard congressional candidate Vonno L. Gudger, of Asheville, make the keynote address of the day, with Lewis P. Hamlin, of Brevard, acting as chairman.

The group of about 60 adopted a resolution, after hearing Burke Ferguson, of Cullowhee, sophomore, and recognized orator of the Young Republican organization.

"And believing in the rule of all the people, expressed by a majority, after a free untrammelled recording of their individual wills in all and each of their votes, hereby state that our stand and position as a party is that the good of the country rises above party, and Americanism and individualism ahead of partisanship.

"And being in entire accord with our Congressional candidate's desires to awaken and arouse all the citizens of this district to a fuller realization that their will is the law, and that he is fighting for independence in, and self assertion by each and every

"And that the retention of his own freedom of action from party bind, or other dictation to thwart his official action if elected, is necessary for him whilst fighting for the restoration of our individual liberties.
