U. S. Makes \$98.88 Profit On Every \$100 Paid On Income Taxes

WASHINGTON—The Treasury calculated it will make about \$98.88 "profit" on every \$100 income tax paid by some 15,000,000 Americans currently struggling over their returns.

In other words, the statisticians found the Treasury was spending \$1.12 for every \$100 in income tax it collected.

The overhead goes into such items as printing up more than 50,000,000 blanks, hiring collectors and bookkeepers, catching swindlers, correcting honest taxpayers' mistakes, and doing research.
