Raises 20,000 Rattlesnakes

COLFAX, Cal.—Seein' snakes? Beeter steer clear of the Foot Hill rattlesnake ranch with its 20,000 or more inhabitants.

This 3,000-acre ranch, one mile west of Colfax on national highway No. 40, literally crawls with rattlers, "au naturel" and in confinement. Believed to be the largest of its kind in the world, the farm is owned and operated by S. E. Evans and his wife, both veterans in the delicate task of handling their temperamental charges.

Evans has handled rattlers for 22 years and has never been bitten. The actual management of the huge ranch is a humdrum business, according to Evans. The interest in the usual enterprise comes from visitors to the ranch, averaging 100 to 200 during the week and 1,000 on Sundays.
