

### Defense Savings Bonds, And Postal Savings Stamps To Go On Sale Today

United States Defense Savings Bonds and Postal Savings Stamps will be placed on sale at the Post Office today, as part of a national effort to make Americans more patriotic.

J. H. Howell announced that plans are nearly completed for this community to do its part at the opening of the savings program.

The new Defense Savings Bond is similar to the familiar "Baby Bonds" of which more than five million dollars worth have been sold by more than two and a half million Americans since 1935.

The Defense Bond may be purchased on May 1, or thereafter, for ten years, this bond worth \$25.00. This is an annual interest return of 3 1/2 per cent, equal to 7 1/2 per cent, compounded semi-annually. Any time after sixty days from the date of purchase, the bond may be redeemed for cash, in whole or in part, with a table of redemption values printed on the face of the bond.

The First National Bank has been named as an authorized seller of the Defense Bonds, and will handle them without commission or profit, it was learned from Jonathan Woody, branch manager.

Investments widely spread all the people in America, a total of \$5,000 has been set on the part of these bonds to be bought by one person in one year. The bonds are in denominations of \$25, \$50, \$100 and \$1,000, all of which are sold for 75 per cent of their maturity value and all of which mature in ten years.

The smaller investor who wishes to buy a Government Bond on a payment plan, the post office will have a new series of Savings Stamps, at 10c, 25c, 50c and \$1. Each purchaser of a Savings Stamp higher than 10c will be given, free of charge,
