Hazelwood Star Leads Industrial League Batters

Joe Scruggs Hits .567 Mark For First Seven Games Of Season.

Joe Scruggs of Hazelwood is setting the batting pace in the Industrial League with a .567 mark, according to averages released recently by Secretary Jim Williamson. The Hazelwood hitter, for the first seven games of the 21-game season, obtained 17 hits in 30 official trips to the plate to top the loop.

Seven pitchers in the league have 1-0 records, but the real leader is Enka's W. Case, with three wins and one loss.

Hazelwood's club is leading in team batting with a .348 mark, while Enka's .955 average tops the loop in team fielding.

Following are the averages for the first seven games, with the batting marked including only those with a .250 or better percentage, and who have been at bat 10 or more times.
