By NEWMAN CAMPBELL (The International Uniform Lesson on the above topic for June 21 is Matthew 28:16-20; Mark 16:14-20; Luke 24:49-53, the Golden Text being Mark 16:15, "Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to the whole creation.")

ACCORDING to St. Mark's account of the resurrection of Jesus, He first appeared to Mary Magdalene, then to the two we heard of last week, who walked with Him on the road to Emmaus. All these told the others of the Risen Lord, but they would not believe. The Lord was on earth for 40 days before His ascension.

Later He appeared to the 11 as they sat at meat (this was still on Easter Day), and upbraided them for their unbelief and hardness of heart, "because they believed not them which had seen Him after He was risen.'

St. Matthew tells us next that the 11 apostles went to a mountain in Galilee where Jesus had 'appointed them.'" We do not know when He gave His command, but He met them there, and when they saw Him, they worshipped Him: but some doubted." Jesus said to them on this oc-

casion, "All power is given unto Me in heaven and in earth." "Go ye therefore, and teach all

nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: "I Am With You Alway"

"Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever, I have com-manded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world."

St. Luke's account of the same happening tells us that Jesus at this time told His apostles to tarry in the city of Jerusalem until "ye be endued with power from on high," in other words, until the Holy Ghost came upon them.

And St. Luke says, "He led them out as far as to Bethany,
