RUBBER RESTRICTION CUTS OUT GIRDLERS

WASHINGTON — Here are the latest fashion notes from the war production board and the rubber administration.
 No more synthetic rubber girdles for women; no more copper nose rings for bulls, and new leather collars for horses.
 Critical war materials are at stake. And the WPB has ruled that copper-nose rings and leather horse collars may be manufactured in limited quantity. However, the rubber czar says that there is not enough synthetic rubber left over to make girdles.
 It is needed for rubber boats and amphibious war equipment first.

FONTANA WORKERS HAVE TRAINING CLASSES

FONTANA DAM — More than 400 employees of the TVA at Fontana Dam are now enrolled in courses designed to equip them to better fill a spot in the war program and to prepare them for post-war work.
 Training classes varying from the skilled trades to public speaking, police training and janitorial work are being taught.
