Former Pastor Here Tells Graduates To Honor, Serve and Glorify God.

"You can gain no sounder wisdom than to realize that you have not learned everything and that the crowning success of the hard earned knowledge you now possess will be in your ability to use it, to honor your country, to serve your fellow man, and to glorify your God", declared Reverend Vincent J. Mahoney, pastor of St. John's church in Tryon, to the graduates of St. John's high school last night.

Discussing the reason for living, the speaker emphasized the great truth that men and women are here for the improvement of world conditions, to get the best out of life, to make the world a better and more comfortable place in which to live.

it more important that a student understand the inner workings of the life of an oyster than it is to know the story of the Incarnation of the Son of God.

He emphasized the fact that a child educated to the dogma that two and two equals four will be morally certain later in life to transact business on a sound formula, but that belief in mathematical certitudes will not make him an honest man, or have any bearings upon his moral standards.
