Tech. Sgt. R. E. Turpin Knocks Out Nazi Planes

An Eighth Air Force Bomber Station, England—T/Sgt. Richard E. Turpin, an Eighth Air Force radio operator and waist gunner, on a B-24 Liberator in the 3rd Bombardment Division, has been awarded the Air Medal for "meritorious achievement . . . coolness, courage and skill" during bombing attacks on Nazi war making installations.

Sergeant Turpin's wife, Mrs. Sara E. Turpin, lives at Sylva and his parents, Mr. and Mrs. John T. Turpin, in Waynesville. Before induction Sergeant Turpin was employed as a show horse trainer. He is a graduate of Waynesville Township high school.

In presenting the Air Medal to the North Carolina flier, Col. Ernest F. Wackwitz, Jr., group commander, commended his skillful participation in bombing attacks which are "knocking out German resistance and helping to insure victory for the Allied armies' invasion of Western Europe."
