The circles of the Woman's Society of the First Methodist church here will meet on next Tuesday at the following places and hours:

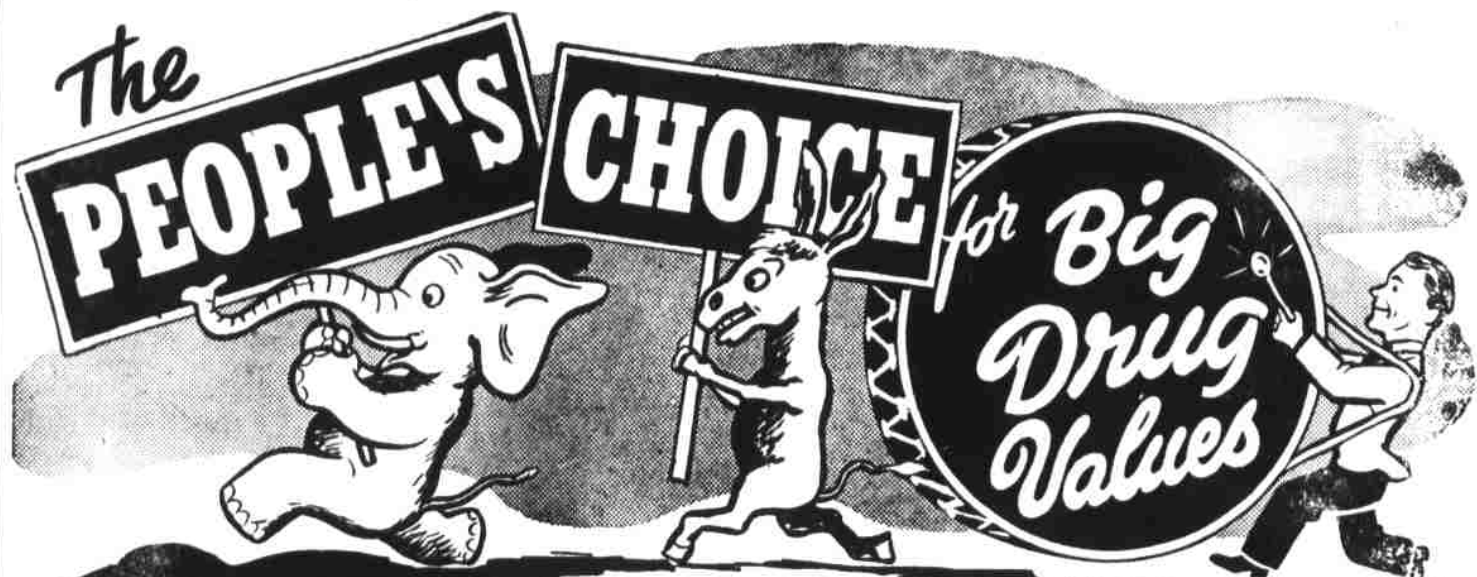
