

### TVA Specialist Gives Lectures Haywood Schools

Illustrated lectures will be given in all the schools of the county, starting yesterday by W. M. Landess and his assistant, Mr. Johnson of the agricultural public relations department of the Tennessee Valley Authority, according to an announcement by Wayne Corpening, Haywood farm agent. #### Vitamin C in Cabbage

Tests at several state experiment stations show that cooked cabbage, held over hot water an hour to keep it warm for serving, loses 70 to 80 per cent of the vitamin C it had when freshly cooked, and in two hours loses 90 per cent. Freshly cooked cabbage contains only about half the vitamin C of raw cabbage. Cooked cabbage held in the refrigerator two or three days and then reheated does not lose as much C as that kept standing on the stove for an hour or two.

#### Cut Selvage Edge

When making your own glass curtains, be sure to cut off the selvage edges before hemming. This little extra trouble in sewing will avoid the disappointment of puckery edges after laundering. This is because a selvage is more tightly woven and tends to shrink more in washing than the body of the curtain.

**Conserves Soap**  
If you use the right amount of soap and measure, don't dump, it saves soap and makes rinsing easier for you. Experience will help you to determine the amount that maintains good suds. **Wild Ducks**  
Wild ducks are apt to have a fishy flavor. This flavor may be lessened by placing in each duck a small peeled carrot, plunging the fowls in boiling water, and simmering for 10 minutes before roasting them. The carrot will absorb the off-flavor and should be removed before stuffing the duck with the dressing. If ducks have little fat, rub some type of fat into the breast before roasting.
