Purchase of the old Academy property on Academy street by the Canton First Baptist church has been announced by the Pigeon River Lodge of Masons, and officials of the church. Transfer of the property was made the latter part of the week, which represents an investment of \$10,000.

It has long been in the possession of the Pigeon River lodge 386 and original plans were to erect a Masonic Temple on the site.
