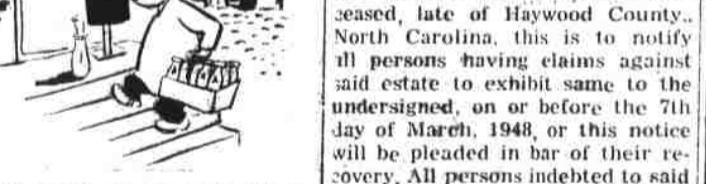
WHAT, BLACKSMITHS IN THE PRINTSHOP?
