Washing West Socks

A word of coution on the washing of wool wocks. They require the same tender care as sweaterslukewerm water for both washing and ringing, and no wringing or artfficial beat. It's wise to trace an outline on paper for size before washing, and pin the sock over this on a towel placed flat for drying. When they are comparatively dry on top, turn them over; later place on the rod of a cout hanger and let circulating air complete the drying process. Another trick is to outline the socks on cardboard and then cut out frames to slip inside during the drying,
