**New Decorations For Walls, Stage At Park Theater**

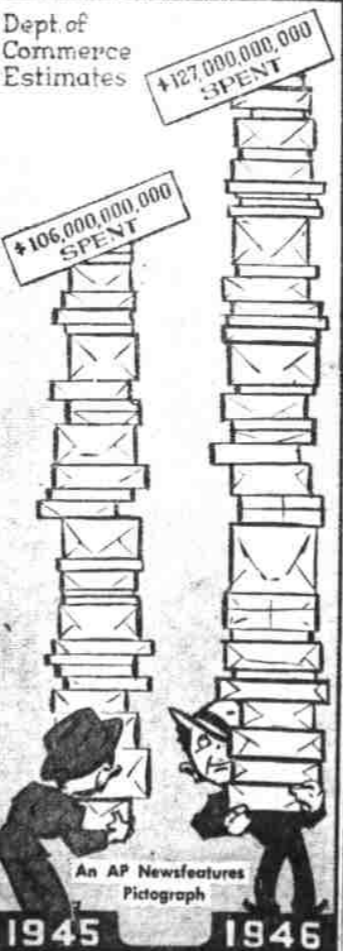
