July saw 203,663 persons visit the Great Smoky Mountains National Park to reach a tourist level of 30 per cent higher than the same month last year.

The number of visitors recorded at parks, monuments, cemeteries, historic sites, memorials and recreational areas for the month was 4,989,329.

Park unit travel for 1947 up to August 1 was 17,777,870. On the basis of the July travel rush, a spokesman for the Park Service predicted a national record high of 24,000,000 persons.

Mrs. Roosevelt Replies To Jim Farley's Articles

In Her Reply, Mrs. FDR Says She Is "Deeply Grieved" By Charges

PHILADELPHIA—Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt declared yesterday in reply to the recent "Why I Broke With Roosevelt" articles by James A. Farley that she is "deeply grieved to find that Mr. Farley was not the person I thought him."

The former first lady, writing in September Ladies Home Journal magazine, commented particularly on the statement by Farley quoting her as having said that "Franklin (the late President Roosevelt) finds it hard to relax with people who aren't his social equals."

About this, Mrs. Roosevelt said: "Mr. Farley has a remarkable memory. I am quite sure the remark which he quotes... could never have been made by me, since I never have had such thoughts."

"It never occurred to me that Mr. and Mrs. Farley felt themselves in any group different from that which we were in."

In his recent series of magazine articles, the former Postmaster General complained that President and Mrs. Roosevelt did not treat Mrs. Farley and himself as social
