Col. Howell, former commander of the 2nd N. C. State Guard regiment, declared that despite the atomic bomb and other scientific developments, a large and welltrained army would be needed in the event of war.

"America must remain strong if we are to preserve the peace," he stated. The bills which have been prepared for Congress to establish UMT program are weaker than the situation demands, Col. Howell added, saying that too much of the raining has been taken away from he military leaders.
