The Church Receives Power

HOLY GHOST DESCENDS UPON APOSTLES

WE ARE told that each of us has more inherent power within us than we ever realize or use. In fact, that we employ but a small fraction of our abilities, and that if we could release them all they would add immeasurably to our efficiency and capacity to meet life's problems and win success.
Books and magazine articles on this subject suggest how we may develop these unused talents and put them to work in the world. Few, however, ever learn the secret and harness it for use to their own and the world's good.
In today's lesson, we find 12 humble, unlearned men gathered in a room waiting for Jesus' promise that such power would come to them to help them carry on His work.
It was on the day of Pentecost—a solemn Jewish festival celebrated on the 50th day (seven weeks) after the Passover—that "suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the

pour out My Spirit upon all flesh: and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams."
Then Peter spoke of Jesus, whom "ye have taken, and by wicked hands have crucified and slain: Whom God hath raised up." David, he said, had spoken concerning these things which all those present had witnessed.
The hearts of the multitude were pricked when they heard Peter's speech, and they asked what they should do. Peter answered, "Repent, and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins, and ye shall receive the gift of the Holy Ghost."
"For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call."
With many other words did Peter testify and exhort, saying, "Save yourselves from this untoward generation."
"Then they that gladly received his word were baptized: and the

house where they were sitting." After the wind there appeared cloven tongues "like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them."
All were filled with the Holy Ghost, and they began to speak in other languages than their own.
Living in Jerusalem were devout men of many nations, and when they were told of this unheard-of thing, they were amazed, and a multitude came to see and hear with their own eyes and ears. They were still more astonished when they heard the apostles utter words that they could understand though they came "out of every nation under heaven."
Among this motley throng were Parthians, Medes, Elamites, dwellers from Mesopotamia, Judaea, Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia; from northern Africa—Lybia, Egypt, "strangers from Rome," in Europe, etc.
Some of the throng were merely amazed and in doubt, but others said the apostles were drunk. But Peter, standing up, lifted up his voice and denied that they had been drinking wine, but that the power that had come to them was the fulfillment of a prophecy by Joel, namely:
"And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, I will

List Your Property Give In Your Poll IN JANUARY

All property owners and taxpayers in Haywood County are required to return to the list takers for Taxation for the year 1950 all the Real Estate, Personal Property, etc., which each shall own on the First day of January.
All male persons between the ages of 21 and 50 are required to list their polls during the same time.
All persons who own property and fail to list it and all who are liable for poll tax and fail to give themselves in will be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor.
