

1,000-Mile Canoe Trip To Far North Planned

ST. LOUIS (UP)—Alpine A. MacArthur of St. Louis, a 23-year-old Ohio State University engineering student, will lay aside his tripod and slide rule this summer and strike out on a 1,000-mile canoe-trip through the Hudson Bay region.

The young Navy veteran, who worked his way westward across the United States just after World War II, will hunt for some of his food on the Canadian jaunt. He will take along a rifle, a Luger pistol and a 65-pound bow with an ample supply of arrows.

The first leg of his journey into the northern wilds will be a train ride of 2,000 miles from the Columbus, O., campus to Pas, a town in western Manitoba.

From Pas he will paddle up the Churchill River to Hudson Bay, 500 miles away.

To Study Needs For Poor And Needy

Much has already been said about the County Home and its management. I am reluctant to make any hasty decision which would dispose of such a splendid physical plant as Haywood's present home. I wish first to study some of the plans and methods used by other counties where the county home has been abolished. I want to investigate the results of such action, and see if the plan would be justified in Haywood.

There are many ways to provide ample care for our poor and destitute people, and I hasten to say, that there may be a better way than now used in Haywood. Yet, I will never be guilty of being a party to throwing these old folk out on the mercy of the world. They are our care, and our just responsibility. I shall vigorously oppose any plan that does not show conclusively to me that it is best for the poor and helpless, and also to the best interest of the taxpayer, which is you, "Mr. and Mrs. Reader."

No Secret Meetings

I believe in a progressive county where the citizens have a definite civic responsibility and keen interest in their government. I feel that all meetings where tax money is involved should be a public meeting, with NO DOORS LOCKED, and where the "welcome sign" hangs on the outside to always welcome you, "Mr. and Mrs. Taxpayer."

For Lower Tax Rate

I feel, in the light of the liquidation of certain obligations, the county will be in a position to reduce the property tax rate, and I PLEDGE, if elected, and these conditions arise, that I will do all in my power to lower the tax burden, insofar as it does not interfere with the progress of our county.

And just as the Agricultural program has gone forward, I keenly feel that similar development of our Industrial and Tourist businesses should be expanded along all practical and modern lines. To this end, and to lend assistance to all three groups, I pledge my continued support.

Rural Fire Department

I would establish a Rural Fire protection system for Haywood County, which would be operated in cooperation with the fire departments of the various towns of the county. I propose the county fire fighting equipment be maintained and operated by the trained firemen of the towns, and that all rural fires be answered just as is done in town. With the extension of our rural telephone system, and the addition of better rural roads, this plan of fire protection would cover the majority of rural areas. Such a plan would put trained men with modern equipment to fight fires just as near as your telephone.
