Corn Club Rules Explained To County Growers

County Agent Wayne Corpening today explained the requirements for membership in the Haywood County Corn Club. His office recently mailed application blanks to county farmers. The requirements of the Haywood Club, he explained, are governed by the rules and regulations of the North Carolina State Corn Contest.

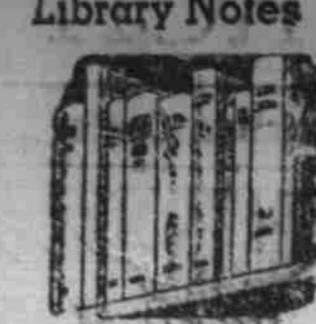
The regulations:
Eligibility—Any citizen of North Carolina. No hybrid seed producer or his tenant, except 4-H, FFA, or NFA, are eligible to receive prizes.
Prizes—A prize will be given to the highest producer on one acre of land in the state. In addition, a prize to the highest producer, on one acre of land, in each of the three areas specified below:
Area 1 constitutes the following counties and all counties east of these counties: Northampton, Halifax, Edgecombe, Wilson, Johnston, Sampson, Cumberland, and Robeson.
Area 2 constitutes all counties between Areas 1 and 3.
Area 3 constitutes the following counties and all counties west of these counties: Stokes, Ydkin, Alexander, Burke, and Rutherford.

WANTED—100 READING CERTIFICATES
During my visits to the Home Demonstration Clubs I took books along and checked them out to the women. Since Achievement Day I have talked to over 300 women and they have taken out 314 books. Many of the women are coming to the Library for additional books. A certificate is awarded to a Home Demonstration Club woman when she has read three approved books and reviewed these books before her club or a similar group. At least one of the three books must be non-fiction. When a Club member has earned one or more Book Review Certificates, she may receive recognition for advanced reading by reading and reporting on five books. The five must include four non-fiction. Each year a list is prepared by the North Carolina Library Commission and books from any of these lists may be read for credit. Following is the 1950 list of the books available at the library or through the Bookmobile service. You may request what strikes your fancy and it will be given to you in your turn.

HOUSING SHORTAGE

HANFORD, Wash. (UP)—This old village, near one of man's most modern factories, is a boom town in reverse. More than 300 town and farm buildings on land bought by the federal government for the Hanford atomic works are being hauled away, some in pieces, others in one chunk. The buildings, condemned as useless to the government, range from chicken coops to seven-room, two-story houses. They are being sold on bids ranging from \$5 to \$2,500. Many of the buildings have not been occupied since the nearby atomic plant site was taken over by the government but the dry eastern Washington weather has preserved them. Most of the buildings are expected to be set up again in nearby hamlets and towns.
