Corn Club Rules Explained To

County Growers County Agent Wayne Corpening today explained the requirements for membership in the Haywood

County Corn Club. His office recently mailed application blanks to county farmers.

The requirements of the Haywood Club, he explained, are governed by the rules and regulations of the North Carolina State Corn Contest. The regulations:

Eligibility-Any citizen of North Carolina. No hybrid seed producer or his tenant, except 4-H, FFA, or NFA, are eligible to receive prizes.

Prizes-A prize will be given to the highest producer on one acre of land in the state. In addition, a prize to the highest producer, on one acre of land, in each of the three areas specified below:

Area 1 constitutes the following counties and all counties east of these countries; Northampton, Halifax, Edgecombe, Wilson, Johnston, Sampson, Cumberland, and Robe-

Area 3 constitutes the following counties and all counties west of these counties; Stokes, Yadkin, Alexander, Burke, and Rutherford. Area 2 constitutes all counties between Areas 1 and 3,

Size and shape of Acre-In measuring with a steel tape, one-half of the average row width will be included beyond the two outside rows. The acre of 43,560 square feet shall have 4 straight sides with the minimum width or length of 70 feet. Quality of Corn-The corn shall Mrs. F. O. Dryman reasonably well in the field, at the Mt. Exper. Station time designated by the Committee to harvest the yield.

Harvesting - No yields, except harvested and weighed yields, will be accepted by the State Committee. Shocked corn or harvested corn is not eligible in the contest.

Committee for Harvesting-The Committee should represent agricultural agencies and businessmen with a chairman from outside the county. The acre must be measured by a county surveyor, a licensed; surveyor or a person recommended Bessie Robinson to Alma Robin- by the County PMA Chairman, A letter of recommendation and qualifications should accompany the certification to the State Committee.

tee-Yields above 148 bushels (the highest harvested yields under the supervision of this Committee) can be disqualified by the Committee unless a member of the State Committee is present at the harvest. Yields above 200 bushels must be harvested in the presence of the

State Committee. Important-Non compliance in regard to any regulation will be considered just reason for disqualifying the certification. Decision of the State Committee will be final in all matters related to the con-


