The couple met during the fifteen months Miss Love spent in Nuremberg as a court reporter for the war crimes trials in 1947-48. She returned to Germany about three weeks ago, making a business trip for a legal firm of San Francisco, California, and plans for the wedding were completed at that time.

The bride was educated at St. Mary's School in Raleigh and at Columbia Institute in Columbia, Tennessee. She held a position for several years with the North Carolina Industrial Commission and was later court reporter for Wake county. She resigned from the latter position to go to Nuremberg.

For the past year she has lived in San Francisco and has done free lance reporting.
