LIBRARY IS FAR DIFFERENT FROM OLD DAYS

Libraries today have gone a long way from the early days when books were chained and couldn't be moved from their places in the library. Certainly they couldn't be taken home to read or study.

Now days if a library is up-to-date it will include films, projectors, music room and recordings, children's reading room, Bookmobile, branches, service to the hospital, study room where clubs might sit down and plan their year's work. Libraries need a room where adults could meet for special programs and children could come for story hours.

Ceiling Projectors are used with bed-ridden patients unable to hold up a book. By use of films the reading is thrown on the ceiling and can be read easily. Talking Books bring many hours of entertainment or study to the blind or those with defective eye sight.
