of the Scouting year—the Patrol Camporee—which will be held on May 19 and 20 at Camp Daniel Boone on Little East Fork of the Pigeon River.

"What will we cook?" "What will we carry in our pack?" "Wonder if it will be cold?" All of these are the questions that the Scouts are asking every time they meet either with the troop or a fellow Scout on the school ground.

R. W. Robertson, of Canton, district camping chairman, is working out the details of the ever-night camporee, assisted by Scout leaders, and patrol applications must be sent to the Council office in Asheville not later than May 12.

The patrols will hike to the camp between 4 and 6 P. M. Friday afternoon, and will break camp about the same time on Saturday. The Scouts must be prepared to cook their supper Friday night, as well as breakfast and dinner on Saturday. The Pigeon River Scout "Special One-Pot meals" will be in evidence, and from their reputations in the past years will be the envy of the most particular Gourmet—for they include in them everything from hot dogs to corn on the cob.

In Manhattan, New York, when builders dig the basement for a new skyscraper, they must use pneumatic stone drills and dynamite to get through the rock,

six prescribed projects. They are:
1. Plan and put on a satisfactory Patrol stunt for the campfire Friday night.

2. Put on a First Aid demonstration, including a traction splint on the leg of the victim.

3. Have on the patrol campsite eight practical uses of Scout knots and hitches.

4. Make a patrol collection of at least 15 leaves of different species found on the campsite.

5. Make a patrol list of 10 species of wild birds found at the campsite and that all members of the patrol can identify.

6. Point out and identify three constellations of stars and locate the North Star (weather permitting, they all hope.)

Regardless of what the weather turns out to be, rainy, cloudy, cold or warm, the boys have been instructed to be prepared. However, according to the Scout motto, the boys are always prepared.

The paraphernalia which they will take is all supposed to have a use, and Scouts are told that they will not be graded on the elaborateness of the equipment but rather on the usefulness of it.

The grading of the patrol will take place immediately upon the arrival of the Scouts at Camp Daniel Boone, and this will be done by the camporee staff. Camporee emblems are awarded to each patrol making a grade of B or above. These are suitable for sewing on the Scout uniform, and are coveted by every boy from Tenderfoot to Eagle Scout.

The camporee will be an experience in the life of every Boy Scout who attends, whether this will be his first year or his fifth. It teaches the citizens of tomorrow the principle of team work working with his patrol, the wonders of nature, and the undiscovered possibilities of the beautiful Boy Scout Reservation.
