Business Manager Is On Job For Cherokee Drama

Carol E. White, theatre executive of Hendersonville and recent manager of Carolina Theatre at Asheville, has established an office at Cherokee as business manager of the most ambitious project in modern Cherokee history, the production of *Unto These Hills*, a drama of the Cherokees.

Unenvied by professional colleagues because of the monumental task facing him until July 1 when the drama opens in Mountsides Theatre, White was well pleased by progress—and by the Great Smoky Mountains now in full spring dogwood-time bloom.

Mountsides Theatre, already dubbed "America's spectacular outdoor theatre" by visiting writers, is basically completed. An old hand at opening new theatres, White was convinced that "we could give a show tonight, if the customers would bring seat cushions." A pictorial record or progress on the theatre and life in the Cherokee area is now complete by Vivian White, photographer on loan from Fontana Village resort.

At White's new office in the Cherokee American Legion building now being transformed into "the most complete information center in the South" by joint effort of the state of North Carolina and the U. S. Indian Service, an even dozen reservations for opening night have been accumulated.

White's immediate unenvied task is to find funds for the finishing touches to Mountsides Theatre to continue its reputation as spectacular and to make it, as he intends, "a vacation-comforted show house." A mere \$10,000, already guaranteed as a loan by personal credit notes of Trustees of Cherokee Historical Association if other promotion fails, is necessary.
