The Church Makes a Better Community—Bobby Jean Bradshaw.

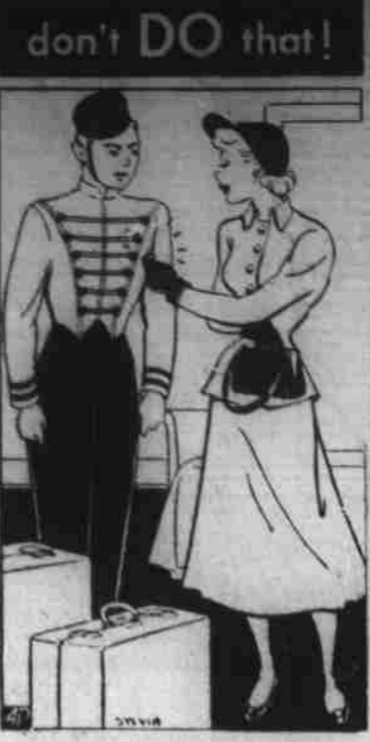
Sylvia Newell read a poem, "I am the Rural Church."

Vital Official INFORMATION FOR ALL VOTERS

(An Official Statement From The Haywood Board Of Elections)

The election officials will be at the polls at 6 A. M. Saturday, May 27.

Voting will begin promptly at 6:30 A. M.

All ballots are wrapped and sealed with a sticker which says they are not to be opened until 6 A. M. Saturday—and then only in the presence of all of the election officials, and any electors at the respective precincts.

The election officials have been instructed to allow any and all voters present to examine the ballot boxes before they are locked at 6:30 A. M.

When presenting yourself to vote, give your name to the registrar.

Be patient, as he is instructed to check your name on the registration book before delivering your ballot.

Vote promptly and leave the voting room immediately after you have cast your ballot.

No one is permitted in the polling place except election officials and those in the act of voting.

Challengers may step into the polling room to challenge. But after doing so, they must retire immediately.

And person who is allowed to vote after being challenged must write his name on the back of all of his ballots.

Any voter citizen living in Waynesville No. 2 and 3 (old South Ward) and Fines Creek Nos. 1 and 2 cannot vote unless he has re-registered. Do not present yourself at any precinct if you are not registered as a Democrat,

except in Beaverdam Township where there is a Republican contest for constable.

Do not ask for a marker unless you are physically unable to mark your ticket or are registered under the Grandfather Clause.

If you need any assistance, come to the polls with a member of your immediate family (father, son, mother, grandfather, grandmother, daughter, brother, or sister).

There are more than 3,200 persons on the registration books in North Ward Waynesville. So vote as early as possible if you live in this ward. Do not wait until late afternoon.

REMEMBER:

Soliciting votes within 50 feet of the polls, and offering to buy or sell votes are violations of the law.

Your Board of County Elections urges you to vote if you are eligible.
