Habakkuk Teaches Trust in God

JEHOVAH WILL OVERCOME EVIL WITH GOOD

Scripture-Habakkuk. really went to live in a watch

By NEWMAN CAMPBELL WHY DOES evil exist in the world? Why do wicked men and women flourish and the good suffer? Why does God permit God-fearing men and women to go hungry "ill-clothed, ill-housed and ill-fed," and ruthless, greedy people to have all the necessities

and luxuries of life? These were questions that worried people in Old Testament days more than 2,000 years ago-just

as they trouble us of today. The Prophet Habakkuk, who is thought to have lived during the reign of Jehoiakin-609-597 B. C. was distressed by it, and decided that trust in God and faith were the answers. Maybe we can reach the same conclusion. Let us study his words:

"The burden which Habakkuk the prophet did see. "O Jehovah, how long shall I cry, and Thou wilt not hear? I

cry out unto Thee of violence, and Thou wilt not save. "Why dost Thou show me in-

iquity, and look upon perversefor destruction and violence are before me; and there is strife, and contention riseth up.

MEMORY VERSE

"I will rejoice in Jehovah, I will joy in the God of my salvation."-Habakkuk 3:18.

"Therefore the law is slacked, and justice doth never go forth; for the wicked doth compass about the righteous; therefore

justice goeth forth perverted. "Art not Thou from everlasting, O Jehovah my God, my Holy One? we shall not die. O Jehovah, Thou hast ordained him for judgment; and Thou, O Rock, hast established him for correc-

You see what was happening in Judah when Habakkuk was living-injustice, violence, strife, rivalry, wickedness. Habakkuk did not condemn men; he counted himself one of them. Even rightliving men, women and children find it hard to live up to their ideals and always do the things they know are right. Why?

God is omnipotent; why does He not interfere? "How long shall I cry?" asks the prophet. How many of us re-echo the query?

Then Habakkuk decided to "stand upon my watch, and set me upon the tower, and will look forth to see what He will speak with me, and what I shall answer concerning my complaint."

We do not suppose Habakkuk

wood, Awake; to the dumb stone, Arise! Shall this teach? Behold, it is overlaid with gold and silver,

and there is no breath at all in the midst of it. "But Jehovah is in His holy temple: let all the earth keep silent before him."

The result of Habakkuk's meditations was that even though everything was discouraging, or, as he puts it in his poetical linguage: "For though the fig tree shall not flourish, neither shall fruit be in the vines; the labor of the olive shall fail, and the fields shall yield no food; the flock shall be cut off from the fold, and there shall be no herd in the

stalls: "Yet I will rejoice in Jehovah, I will joy in the God of my sal-

vation. "Jehovah, the Lord, is my strength; And He maketh my feet like hinds' feet, and will make me to walk upon high places." .

If we have the same trust in the goodness and power of God, and do His work of peace and justice upon earth, we too can cease to be too troubled about our contentious world.

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
