

When you are braising or stewing chuck beef steak, try using tomatoes for the liquid instead of water. The difference in stewing and braising lies in the amount of liquid called for. Braising uses only a little liquid. Stewing calls for enough liquid to partially cover the meat.

## Ice Cream For The Party

Children will enjoy having the usual ice cream dessert varied

for a party. Milk supplies are high in June so there will be lots of ice cream around for these desserts. Include other dairy foods in party menus, too — milk to drink (plain or chocolate flavored) and cheese for sandwiches. If you're giving the youngsters luncheon serve a cream soup (using milk) as the first course.

If you've wondered what food values ice cream offers you'll be interested to know that roughly speaking, a serving of ice cream (2/3 cup) gives you the same nutrients you get when you drink half a glass of milk. So it's good party food and good for family desserts, too.

For short storage remember to put the ice cream carton on the bottom shelf of the freezing unit in your refrigerator. Or else, empty the ice cream into an ice tray, cover it with waxed paper or aluminum foil and keep it in the freezing unit.

For very young fry choose a circus theme for the party table with clown place cards and circus napkins. Then for dessert serve generous dishes of vanilla ice cream topped with balloons made of cherries stuck on toothpicks. Youngsters enjoy a simple variation such as this just as much as a fancy dessert.

The grammar-school or teen-age set will enjoy something a little more sophisticated than the young fry... an ice cream and mint combination, for instance.

### MINT CHOCOLATE SUNDAY

Ingredients: 1 square (1 ounce) unsweetened chocolate, 1 tablespoon butter, 1/3 cup milk, 1 cup sugar, 2 tablespoons light corn syrup, 1/4 teaspoon salt, 3 to 4 drops essence of peppermint, 1 quart vanilla ice cream.

Method: Melt chocolate over hot water, add butter and blend. Stir in milk and bring to boil stirring constantly. Add sugar and syrup, while stirring. Simmer about 5 minutes; add peppermint and blend. Dish vanilla ice cream into large serving bowl or individual dishes. Decorate with candy mints and serve with mint chocolate sauce. Serves 6.
