PHILADELPHIA (UP) -Persons recovered from heart attacks are beter risks for employers than unimpaired workers, according to a heart specialist.


are about two per cent more productive, while their records show them to be more dependable and grateful. He is chairman of the Philadelphia Heart Association's rehabilitation division.
