

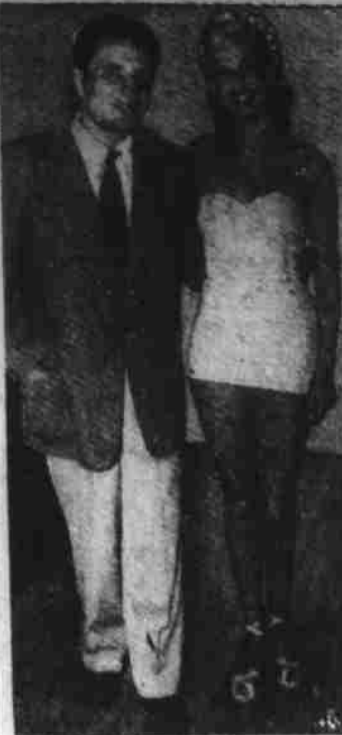
### Duff Plans Homecoming Day August 20

### It's Garden - Relish Time



**HOMEMADE CORN RELISH** . . . Delicious with fish . . .

Now is the time to put up some homemade corn relish to store on your pantry shelf. It'll be a wonderful pickup later on for a hamburger meal—delectable with meat loaf (hot or cold), chicken (fried, broiled, or roasted), and perfect for the night you take things easy and serve the family hamburgers on toasted rolls. If Friday fare means fish in your household, you'll find the following Corn Relish is good with both fillets and fish steaks.

First preserving pointer is to choose vegetables that are fresh, young, and of good quality. You'll get the best result this way.

Don't try to make relishes by "feel" — standard measurements really pay off here. Follow the directions in your recipe exactly.

A distilled white vinegar, of a uniform acidity, makes a fine preserving medium. A good vinegar of this kind will be crystal-clear, and it will help retain the bright garden colors of your vegetables, as well as mellow with them to a fine flavor.

Be careful not to use jars and lids that have nicks or cracks. And be conscious about sterilizing when directed. Follow the directions that come with your preserving containers scrupulously.

### CORN RELISH

**Ingredients:** 10 to 12 ears corn, 1 cup chopped green peppers (2 medium), 1 cup chopped sweet red peppers (2 medium), 1 1/4 cups chopped onions, 1 cup chopped celery, 1 1/2 cups sugar, 2 tablespoons prepared yellow mustard, 1 1/2 tablespoons mustard seed, 1 tablespoon salt, 1 tablespoon celery seed, 1 quart distilled white vinegar, 3/4 cup water, 1/2 teaspoon turmeric.

**Method:** Boil corn for 5 minutes; dip in cold water. Cut it from cob and measure 2 1/2 quarts. Place in kettle of enamelware, aluminum, or stainless steel. Add remaining ingredients and boil gently for 20 minutes, stirring often. Pack while boiling into sterilized jars. Be sure vinegar solution covers all vegetables. Fill jars to not more than 1-inch from top. Seal for boiling water bath method. Submerge in a boiling water bath. Process for 15 minutes. Makes 7 1/2 pints.
