### Father Of Howard Clapp Taken By Death

Simpson Cornelius Clapp, 71, father of Howard Clapp of Waynesville and former North Carolina State Test Farm director, died in an Asheville hospital Monday afternoon.

Funeral services were conducted Tuesday afternoon in Kenilworth Presbyterian Church with the pastor, the Rev. Paul N. Gresham, officiating. Interment was in Pine Grove Cemetery.

Mr. Clapp devoted 43 years of service to North Carolina agriculture. He was formerly nursery and orchard inspector for the N. C. Department of Agriculture, Raleigh, and was superintendent of the State Test Farm at Swannanoa. From 1939 to 1941 he was manager of the Farmers Federation Seed Department in Asheville.

He was a member and elder of Kenilworth Presbyterian Church, a member of the Swannanoa Masonic Lodge and a 32nd degree Scottish Rite Mason.

Surviving in addition to Howard Clapp are the widow, and six children, Dr. Hubert L. Clapp of Swannanoa, Mrs. C. A. Collins of White Plains N. Y., Mrs. H. A. Van Trease of Nashville, Tenn., Mrs. Bryon H. worth of High Point, Mrs. John Stubbs of Raleigh, and Charles Graham Clapp, serving with the United States Army in Fort Jackson, and five grandchildren.
