Scripture—II Corinthians 11:16-33; 12:7-10; Philippians 2:4-11; II Timothy 4; James 1:2-4.



"To defend himself from those who would supplant him in leadership, Paul wrote to the Corinthians to tell of his sufferings in the cause of Christ. 'Thrice was I beaten with rods,' he wrote.



"Once was I stoned," Paul wrote to the church at Corinth; "thrice I suffered shipwreck, a night and a day I have been in the deep; in journeyings often in peril of waters, in peril of robbers."



"In weariness and painfulness, in watchings often, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness; besides those things which cometh upon me daily, the care of the churches."



Also Paul told of the time when he was threatened with capture by authorities, "and through a window in a basket was I let down by the wall, and escaped." MEMORY VERSE—James 1:2-3.

THE PARABLES



OF COVETOUSNESS AND WORLDLY CAREFULNESS

(Tenth of a series of condensations of the parables of Jesus taken from the Bible.)

AND HE SPAKE a parable, saying:

The ground of a certain rich man brought forth plentifully: And he thought, what shall I do, because I have no room where to bestow my fruits? And he said, I will pull down my barns, and build greater; and there will I bestow all my fruits and my goods. And I will say to my soul, Soul, thou hast much goods laid up for many years; take thine ease, eat, drink, and be merry.

BUT GOD said unto him, Fool, this night thy soul shall be required of thee: then whose shall those things be, which thou hast provided? So is he that layeth up treasure for himself, and is not rich toward God.

And He said to His disciples: Therefore take no thought for your life, what ye shall eat; neither for the body, what ye shall put on. Life is more than meat, and the body is more than raiment.

Consider the ravens: They neither sow nor reap, neither have storehouse nor barn, and God feedeth them. How much more are ye better than the fowls?

And which of you with taking thought can add to his stature one cubit? If ye then be not able to do that thing which is least, why take ye thought for the rest?

CONSIDER THE LILIES, how they grow: they toil not, they spin not; and yet Solomon in all his glory was not arrayed as one of these. If then God so clothe the grass, which is today in the field, and tomorrow is cast into the oven; how much more will he clothe you, O ye of little faith?

Seek not ye what ye shall eat, or what ye shall drink, neither be ye of doubtful mind. For all these things do the nations of the world seek after: and your Father knoweth that ye have need of these things. But rather seek ye the kingdom of God; and all these things shall be added unto you.

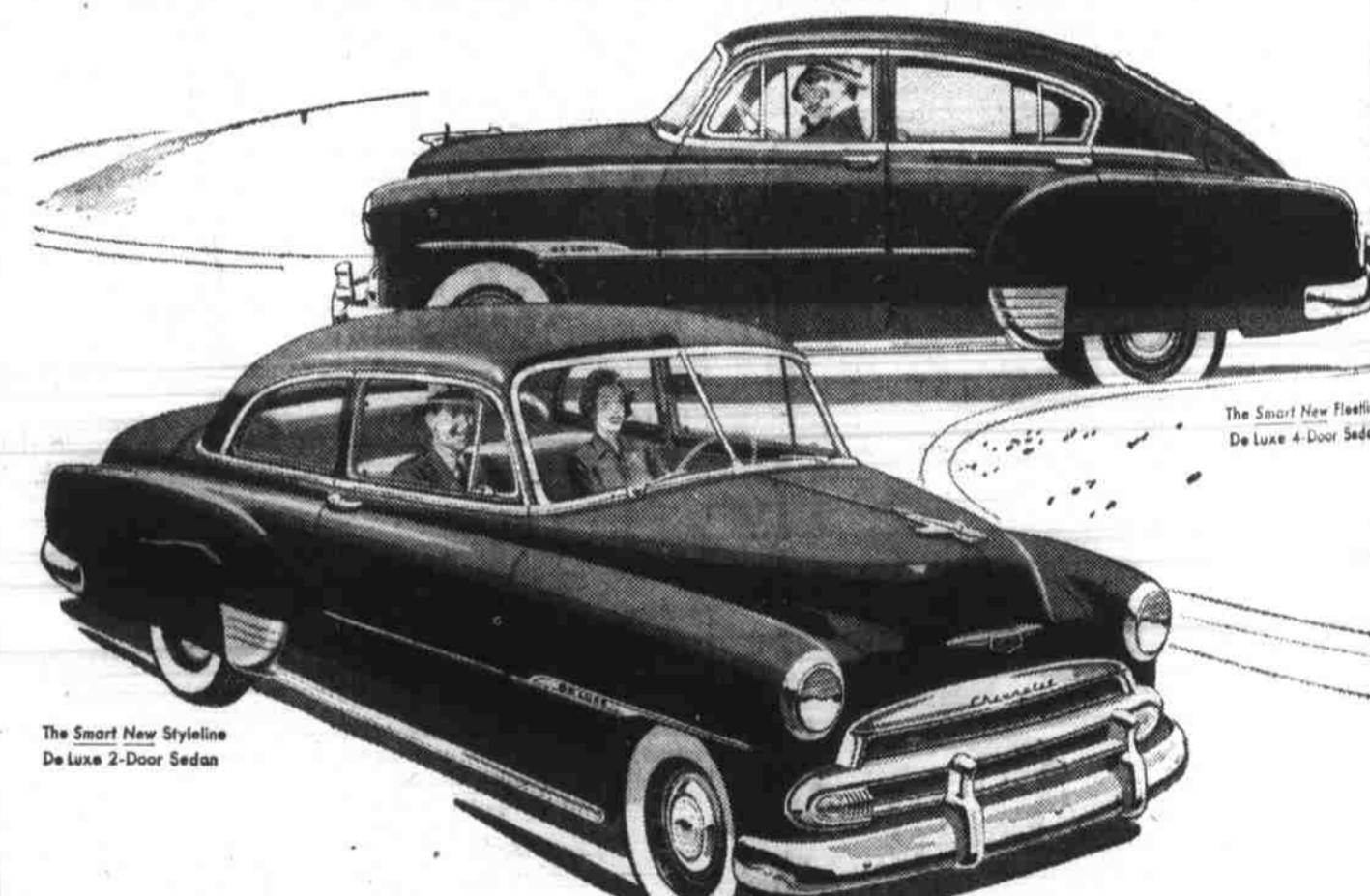
