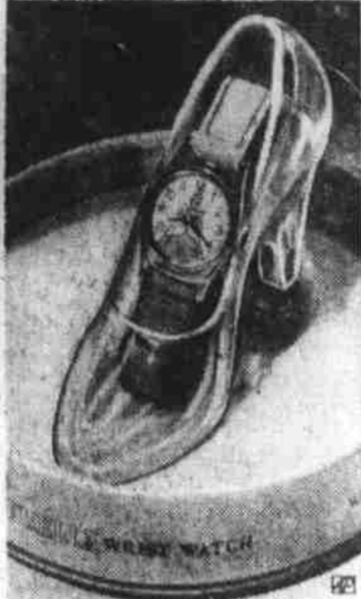

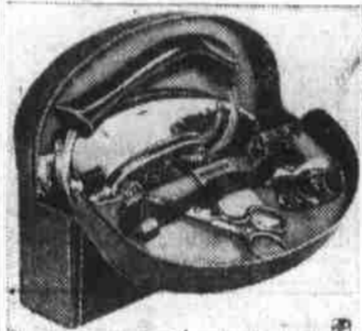

Saws Used in Home
The saws commonly used in the home are the hacksaw and the handsaw. The hacksaw is used to cut metal and the handsaw to cut wood. There are two types of handsaws, the rip saw to cut with the grain and the crosscut to saw across the grain. All saws should be kept sharp. In starting a saw cut, the thumb of the left hand should be used to guide the blade until the cut is started at the desired location. The first stroke of the saw should be in the up direction. Sufficient pressure should be used when starting the cut so that the saw immediately begins to bite into the wood.

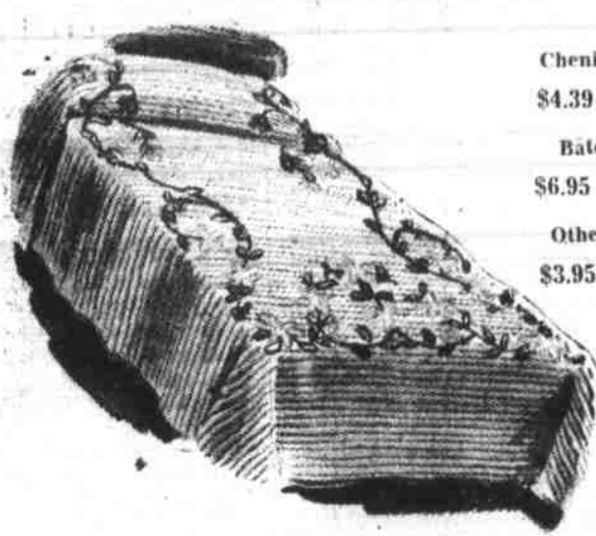

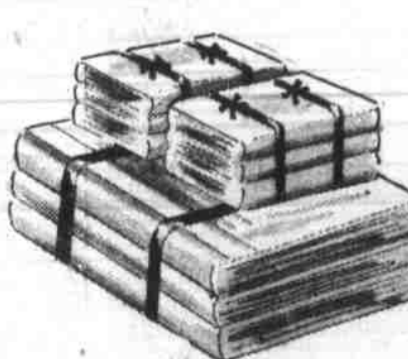

Hazelwood Church To Vote On Budget

The congregation of the Hazelwood Baptist Church will vote on a proposed \$14,000 budget unanimously approved last Sunday by the church's deacons.

The budget recommended for 1951 by the deacons is \$4,000 greater than that of 1950.

The figures were made public today by the Rev. M. L. Lewis, who is rounding out his fifth year as pastor.

A four-member committee worked out the budget and submitted it to the deacons for approval.

Of the total, \$12,320 is tabbed for local work, \$1,180 for missions, and \$500 for special gifts.

The provisions for local work include the salary of the pastor and janitor, expenses for maintenance and repair of the church's physical plant, publication expenses, and payment toward retirement of the debts on the building and organ.

The deacons approved a \$3,000 allocation for the fund for the auditorium, in the provisions for the local work.
