Power, Micheline Prelle... stage comedian who went from "John Loves Mary" and "Small Wonder" to film success in "Adam's Rib"; Bob Patten, Tommy Cook, Juan Toren, Jack Elam, Robert Barrat and Carleton Young Barrat, whose resemblance to the great man is uncanny, appears as General Douglas MacArthur. They are long-famed look-alikes. For Power the trip to the Philippines was hardly anything new. As much a world traveler as a movie star, he recently starred in "Prince of Foxes" in Europe and "The Black Rose" in England and Africa. Currently he is "Mister Roberts" on the London stage, an assignment he took on after concluding "Guerrilla" and a subsequent release, "Rawhide". Miss Prelle, Micheline Presle to French movie-goers until recently, scored international renown in "Devil in the Flesh" and made the trek to Hollywood for the French-backed "Under My Skin" opposite John Garfield a year ago.

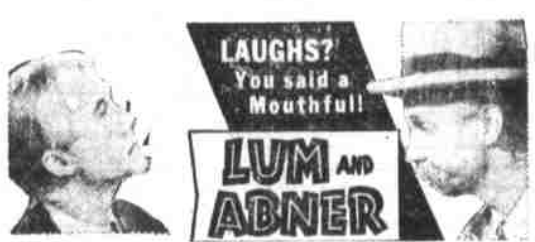
