"The Missleer," the camp paper, had this to say about Miller: "S/Sgt. Paul M. Miller, the five foot five inch 'human jumping jack' of last season's PAFB Missleer baseball team, was named as playing assistant coach of this year's squad recently by Capt. Curtis S. Butler, head coach.

"Called the jumping jack because of his ability to leap into the air and snag any ball thrown to him at first base in spite of his lack of athletic altitude, Miller's hustle and drive added much to last year's ball club.

"Miller is the first of several assistant coaches to be named in the near future. Head coach Butler plans to divide the squad into groups with a coach in charge of each group.

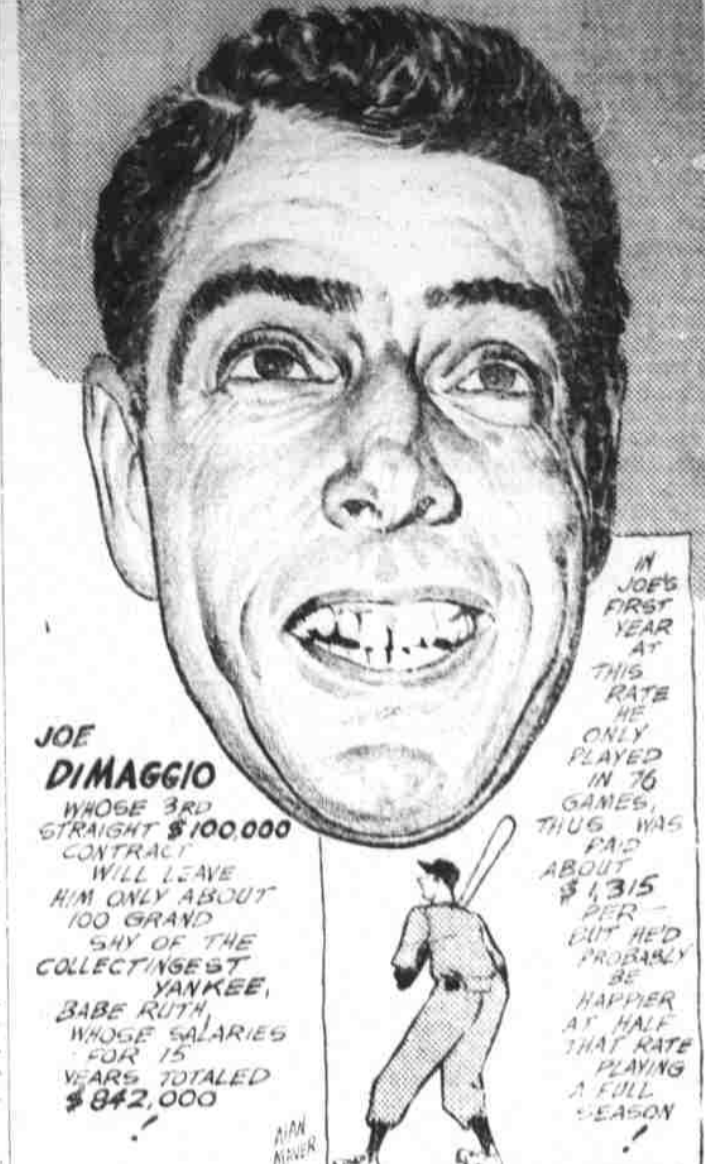
