# Sunday School Lesson

## GOD'S WONDERFUL CREATION

HOW MANIFOLD ARE THE LORD'S WORKS!

Scripture—Genesis 1-2; Psalm 104; John 1:1-3.

THIS LESSON gives us the  
narrative and dignified Bible story  
of the creation of our beautiful  
world. To be truly religious, it  
is to this writer that children  
should be taught very early to ap-  
preciate what a truly wonderful  
world it is in which we live. An  
illustration taken from life illus-  
trates the point. It is that of a  
new-born child who, while out-  
rigger, called his mother's atten-  
tion to a gorgeous sunset.  
"How beautiful," he said, "I  
enjoying all its beauties,  
more recently God's great  
deeds. While we deplore the  
destruction of earth's  
beauties by thoughtless men, we  
gain a greater faith in God  
His power to eventually, in  
own time, bring brotherhood,  
peace and peace to all man-  
kind.

The waters were peopled with  
life and the fowls of the air were  
created—"whales, and every liv-  
ing creature that moveth, which  
the waters brought forth abun-  
dantly, after their kind, and every  
winged fowl after his kind; and  
God saw that it was good."  
"And the evening and the morn-  
ing were the fifth day."  
The beasts of the earth came  
next, cattle, and every creeping  
thing. Last, God made man "in  
His own image, in the image of  
God created He him; male and  
female created He them."  
"And God blessed them, and  
said unto them, Be fruitful, and  
multiply, and replenish the earth,  
and subdue it; and have dominion  
over the fish of the seas, and over  
the fowl of the air, and over every  
living thing that moveth upon the  
earth."  
Thus ended the sixth day, and  
on the seventh God rested from  
His labors, blessed this day and  
made it holy.  
The second chapter of Genesis  
gives a more detailed account of  
the making of man and woman  
and then tells us of the beautiful  
garden in which God put this man

the spirit of God moved upon the  
face of the waters."  
"And God created light, and

under the firmament were divided  
from those above, and "God called  
the firmament Heaven."  
"On the third day saw the gath-  
ering of the waters together and  
the earth appeared, and the earth ap-  
peared, and was given its name."  
"And God said, Let the earth  
bring forth grass, the herb yield-  
ing seed, and the fruit tree yield-  
ing fruit after its kind, whose  
seed is in itself, upon the earth;  
and it was so."  
"On the fourth day "God made  
the great lights; the greater  
light to rule the day, and the  
lesser light to rule the night; He  
also made the stars also."  
"And God set them in the firm-  
ament of the heaven to give light  
unto the earth."

and woman, warning them, how-  
ever, that there was one tree the  
fruit of which they must not eat.  
It was the tree of the "knowl-  
edge of good and evil." If they ate  
of its fruit, they would surely die,  
God told them.  
In these two chapters the man  
is named Adam, but we do not  
learn the woman's name until the  
third chapter.  
There will hardly be time  
enough in this class to read the  
104th psalm, but the teacher  
should read parts of it aloud, or  
have children old enough to read  
it, read, each one in turn. Its  
poetry is beautiful, and majestic,  
and it emphasizes the wonder of  
the creation and the psalmist's  
thankfulness for them, and espe-  
cially for the goodness of the  
Maker of all things thereon.  
"O Lord, how manifold are  
Thy works! In wisdom hast Thou  
made them all: the earth is full  
of Thy riches."  
"I will sing unto the Lord as  
long as I live: I will sing praise  
to my God while I have my being."  
"My meditation of Him shall be  
sweet: I will be glad in the Lord."
