**Movie Star Starts Drive To Help Homeless Koreans**

HOLLYWOOD — Doug Fairbanks, Jr., wants your old clothes. Also shoes, blankets, food, and money. He wants 'em for 6,000,000 Korean civilian refugees living largely in the open or under tents or bits of clothing strung together.

"There's a tremendous disease and death rate among the children," the world-minded movie star said. "All you have to do is look at the newsreels and pictures in the papers to see what the need is."

Fairbanks has been appointed by the State Department as national chairman of American Relief for Korea.

"This has been set up under auspices of the State Department," he said. "It has the support of leading church and relief agencies—Quakers, Catholics, Protestants, Jews, all denominational groups, as well as charitable groups. It's a coordination of all agencies so that relief can be fungeled through one medium, on a national basis."

Doug said his "saving grace is an ability to departmentalize my time." The day I dropped in at his big white home, he'd made two trans-oceanic phone calls. One was to London associates in the forthcoming production there of Bette Davis-Gary Merrill film. The other call was to a relief official and a member of MacArthur's staff in Tokyo in connection with the Korean relief project.

The fit-looking star, slouched in an enormous soft sofa, said he was flying to New York in a few days. He'd do a radio show, work on the Korean matter and financing of the film. In Belgium and Holland he would make speeches as vice-president of the United Nations Association. In Sweden he would "do something with the Red Cross." He took on the Korean-relief post after four years as national chairman of the CARE Committee.
