## Locals To Take On Cullowhee

Friday afternoon found the Waynesville High School baseball diamond looking quite lively for the third consecutive day of practice this year.

Due to weather conditions, the team has been limited in out-of-door practice, but the boys are looking better every day.

The afternoon sessions have been long, and emphasis was placed on bunting drills Friday.

The reason for the bunting is the lack of power at the plate in the prospects for this year's team.

Thursday afternoon Coach Marshall Teague held his first intersquad contest, and the lettermen defeated the newcomers, 7-5.

On the winning team it was Ralph Jenkins and Jimmy Frady pitching to Alden McCracken, and Frady was the winning pitcher.

The opposition had Jimmy Swift and Jimmy Kuykendall throwing to veteran catcher James Fugate.

Wednesday afternoon at 3:00 o'clock the baseball fans in this area will see the boys in uniform for the first game with Cullowhee High School.

Coach Teague has announced his probable starting line-up as follows: left field—Terry Swanger, center field—Bobby Kuykendall, right field—J. C. DeWeese, third base—Joel Burrell, short stop—Bill Sutton, second base—Carroll Swanger, first base—Bobby Robinson, catcher—James Fugate.

Teague will probably start Jenkins or Kuykendall on the mound.

The eleven game schedule that Coach Teague has lined up for his team is one of the toughest that can be found in high school circles in the Blue Ridge Conference.

The traveling squad of players will have to be cut to fourteen boys, because there are only that many uniforms. At the present time there are about 22 boys out for practice each day.

However, Coach Teague says that he will not select just 14 players for his team. He will use an alternating system which will give more of the boys a chance to see some action this season.

## Knee Pants League Will Meet Wednesday To Map Plans For 66 - Game Season

The thud of the horsehide against the ash, and in the catcher's mitt, will soon resound as twelve teams of the Knee Pants League swings into action.

The adult managers, and the sponsors of the individual teams, will meet Wednesday night at the Hazelwood town hall and discuss the last-minute details for the league swinging into full action on May 25th.

The schedule committee, in making a tentative report recently, suggested play to begin May 25th, with three days per week, and two games each of the three days. All teams would play once a week. The present schedule runs eleven weeks, or a 66-game season for the league.

E. C. Wagenfeld, president of the league, has asked that all managers and sponsors attend the meeting Wednesday night, when the unfinished details will be completed. Among the matters to claim the attention of the group will be the question of admission charges.

The estimated operating cost of the league for the season was set at \$312. Each sponsor is paying the cost of uniforming his team, while the league must furnish the balls, bats, bases, and other necessary items. The largest two single items include five dozen balls (\$105) and six bats for each team, at a cost of \$144.

## Fishermen Getting Set For Season Opening In State Streams Sunday

Dates for fishing in National Forest trout streams were announced yesterday by D. J. Morris, supervisor of Pisgah National Forest.

The areas open for supervised fishing in Pisgah are Mt. Mitchell, Daniel Boone, Rich Laurel, Sherwood and Pisgah game preserve.

In Nantahala National Forest, the open areas will be Standing Indian, Fires Creek, Wayah Bald and Santeetlah. Cliffside Lake in Nantahala will be open from June 1 to August 31.

Cliffside Lake in Nantahala will be open from June 1 to August 31. Daily permits, costing \$1, will be required of all fishermen. The nimrods also must carry State fishing licenses. Fishing will be permitted only from 6 a.m. to 8 p.m. and the lucky fishermen may take

not more than 10 trout of any size.

Only artificial lures will be permitted in the Pisgah Preserve, North and South Harper Creek in Daniel Boone, and the Middle Prong of West Fork of Pigeon River in Sherwood.
