SAN ANTONIO — (AP) — The men of the U. S. Air Force are turning to religion. An average of 12,000 airmen now attend the 115 services offered by Lackland Air Force Base chaplains in the ten chapels on the base. There are more than 30 chaplains, representing all faiths.

Sunday services are held from early morning until late evening. Because the chapels won't hold the crowds, two theaters and a large assembly tent are used for religious services.
