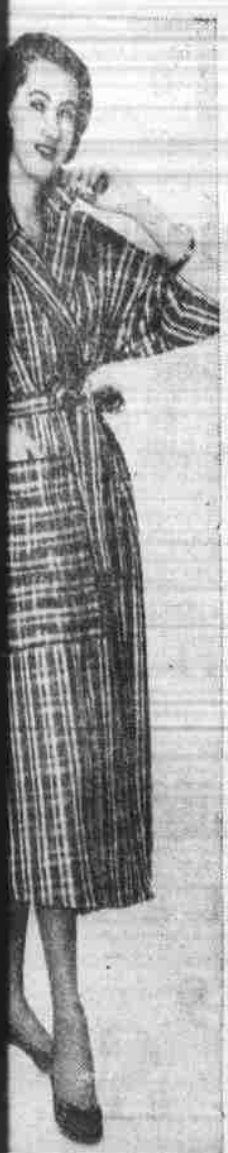

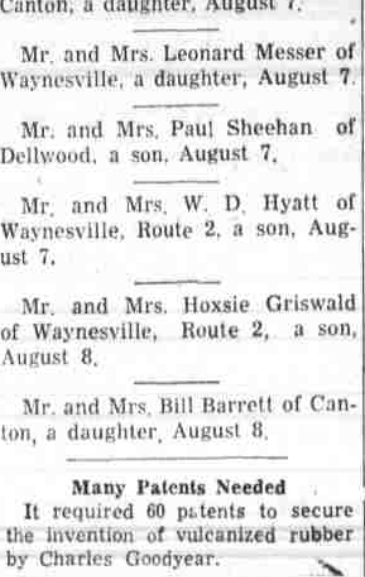

### Heads Rodeo



H. D. (Tarvia) Jones, head of the Department of Motor Vehicles' Highway Safety Division has been appointed assistant director of the North Carolina Truck Rodeo, to be held in the Greensboro Memorial Stadium July 27 and 28. Announcement of Jones' appointment was made today by J. T. Outlaw, executive secretary of the North Carolina Motor Carriers Association, sponsor of the event. The annual truck driver's outing is expected to attract drivers from all corners of the state. Entrants must have a one-year accident free record to compete in the Rodeo. State winners in each of the three vehicle classifications—straight truck, single-axle tractor and tandem tractor—will go to Chicago for further competition on the national level. Jones will automatically succeed Edward W. Ruggles next year as director of the Rodeo.
