Community Pilot Farm Plan Being Set Up In Haywood

Community Pilot Farms for Haywood County will be selected shortly by members of the various sections taking part in the Community Development Program. Names are to be submitted to the Demonstration Farmers organization or to the County Agent's office.

This new program, sponsored by the State Extension Service, the N. C. Experiment Station, the T.V.A. and other farm agencies, will to a large extent replace the Demonstration Farm program. The plan calls for a Pilot farm in each organized community.

Some of the qualifications for farms to be selected, according to the County Agent's office, are that the farm be of average size, that the farmer and his wife be of average age, and that the plan be
