

THE TRIALS OF JESUS

JESUS BEFORE PILATE

After the betrayal, Jesus appears before four officials. He was beaten, scourged, abused, ridiculed and then taken out to be crucified.

First, He came before Annas who was father-in-law of Calaphas, who was high priest that year. Then He was taken for a hearing before Caiaphas. It was at these hearings that Peter denied Christ three times as the Savior had prophesied he would. "And he went out and wept bitterly."

Jesus was then taken before Pilate. "I find no crime in Him," the Roman governor told the mob. He proposed to chastise Jesus and then release Him. But the mob screamed for death,

Pilate discovered that his Prisoner was from Galilee and therefore was a subject of King Herod who happened to be in the city. He therefore sent Him to Herod to be tried. But Herod sent him back to Pilate who pointed out that His own king had found Him innocent,

Matthew 26:57-75; 27:1-31; Mark 14:53-72; 15-1-20; Luke 22:54-71; 23:1-25; John 18:12-40; 19:1-18.

The crowd still howled for death. "So when Pilate saw that he was gaining nothing, but rather that a riot was beginning, he took water and washed his hands before the crowd, saying, 'I am innocent of this Man's blood; see to it yourselves.' And all the people answered, "His blood be on us and on our children! Then he released for them Barabbas, and having scourged Jesus, delivered Him to be

"Then the soldiers of the governor took Jesus into the practorium, and they gathered the whole battalion before Him. And they stripped Him and put a scarlet robe upon Him, and plaiting a crown of thorns they put it on His head, and put a reed in His right hand. And kneeling before Him they mocked Him, saying 'Hail, King of the Jews.' And when they had mocked Him, they stripped Him of the robe, and 'put His own clothes on Him and led Him away to crucify Him,"






