| Charles E. Mitner. County Sanitarian, said today that we have a real need for carrying on a well planned rabies co Haywood County. <br> The schedule of clinics for rabies inoculation program will begin Monday, April 20. A special rate has been made and will be charged all persons who bring their dogs to the various places designated by the Health Department. <br> Most of the counties in N, C. have had rabies in their animals during the past year," Milner said. "These rabid animals are no respecters of county lines. As long as there is one rabid dog in the state, there will be constant danger to other areas. <br> "A four point program is being launched by counties throughout gram includes: (1) Vaccination of | all dogs; (2) Elimination of stray dogs by cooperation of law enforcement officers and dog wardens; (3) Information to the public about rabies control; (4) Evaluation of statistics for future action. <br> "A great deal can be accomplished through counties cooperating. By reducing the number of cases of rabies in animals, we can eventually eliminate the disease. At the same time, fewer people will have to take the long and painful antirabic treatment given following dog bites. <br> The economic loss from rabid animats biting captle and hogs can be reduced.
