Music Club Meet Wednesday At Spaldon

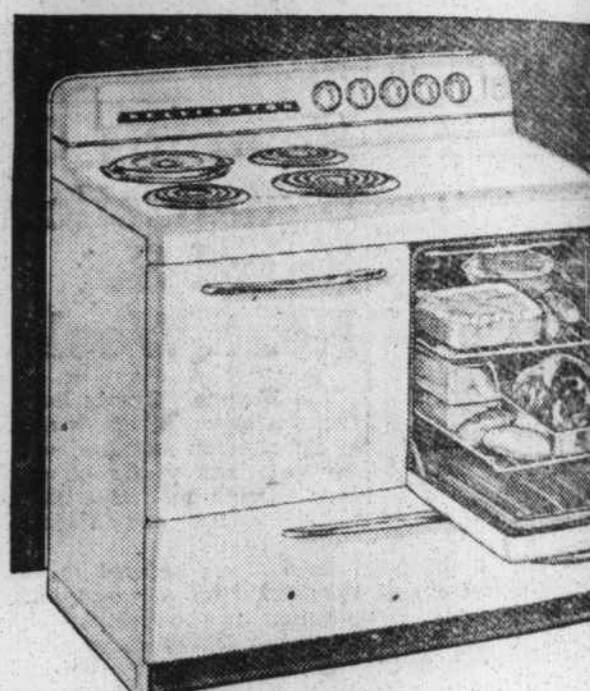
The Western Carolina student chapter of the National Club hold its annual dinner at Spaldon on May 11 o'clock.

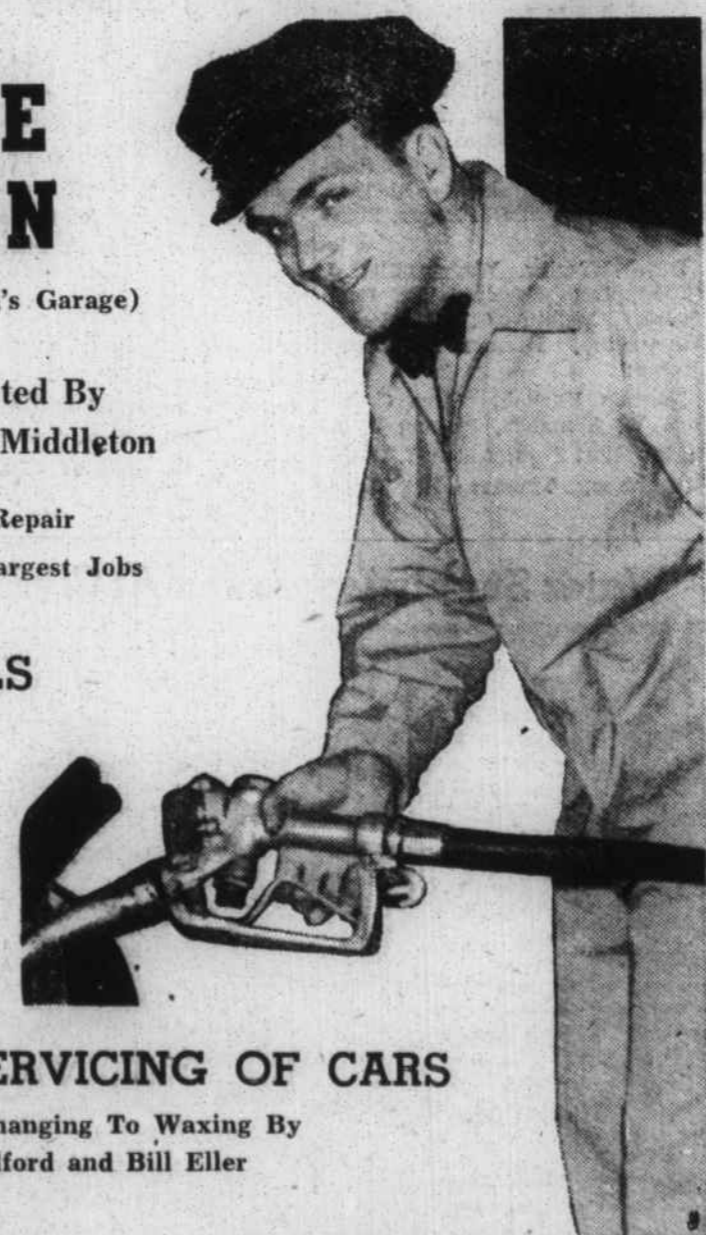
