



House were brought out. Not only is the department itself badly handicapped by cramped quarters, but, as Commissioner Allison pointed out, the county is outgrowing the whole Court House, and the more divisions that can be moved out, the more efficient the operation of the ones that stay. "The biggest inducement that I see," said Commissioner Allison, "is that we are about to grow out of this Court House; and the second biggest is getting 71 cents for put-Another advantage of the proposed center was stressed by Mr. "New industries are attracted to an area," he explained, "by provision for health and wellbeing of their employees. Along with hospitals, golf courses, school buildings, churches and swimming pools, they always inquire about a medical diagnostic center. An industry that moves here and em-


ploys a hundred people is apt to pay back the cost of building and staffing a medical center." Mrs. Bert Cagle of West Pigeon gave her opinion that "we need this more than we need a lot of other things. scirbed the pride he had witnessed of the people who had built the Lexington and Statesville centers. and Mr. Nix stressed that purchasing a necessity at the lowest cost was always good business. Edwin Haynes of Canton suggested, "If we can't lay the cash on the line today, we should set aside a contingent fund which would be available if our request for a Federal grant is approved.


