Canton Schools To Open Aug. 31

Schools of the Canton system will open on Monday. August 31, it has been announced by Rowe Henry, the newly elected superintendent.

The Canton schools usually do not open until after Labor Day, but since the holiday falls almost a week later, on September 7th, the school board has set the opening date for the 31st. This does not mean the student body will not have a holiday, however. Mr. Henry pointed out that Labor Day would be observed as has been the custom.

The age for entering school for the first year has been changed from October 1, to 15th. That means that if a child reaches his sixth birthday on October 15, he will be eligible to enroll this year. According to a ruling by the Attorney General, if a child were born on October 16, he would be

born on October 16, he would be considered six years old on the 15th, but later than that date he would have to wait until the following year to enter school.


