Sunday School Lesson

The Christian's War--Temperance

TAKE THE WHOLE ARMOR OF GOD TO WITHSTAND THE EVIL ONE

Scripture—Romans 14:13-21; 1 Corinthians 9:24-27; Ephesians 6:10-20.

WE DEPLORE wars between nations and the seemingly needless slaughter of fine young men in the name of religion. All nations look toward a time when such wars will cease and the world will be at peace.
 All life is a battle, however, a constant war of good against evil—God against Satan—as Paul writes out in our lesson today. It is possible that there are more temptations to resist in our modern world than there were in St. Paul's day, but the same sins that he mentions are with us, and we need to reread his militant words to help fight them.
 Let us not therefore judge one another any more; but judge this together, that no man put a stumbling block or an occasion to fall in his brother's way."

letic contests—baseball, horse racing, hockey, football, etc.
 "Know ye not that they which run in a race run all, but one receiveth the prize? So run, that ye may obtain.
 "And every man that striveth for the mastery is temperate in all things," and Paul adds, "they do it to obtain a corruptible crown; but we an incorruptible."
 No man or woman training for any athletic contest can indulge his appetites. He or she must "be temperate in all things," another valuable lesson for Christian living.
 We need, indeed, "the whole armor of God, that we may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil."
 Do you remember in John Bunyan's *Pilgrim's Progress*, how Apollyon, the evil spirit, attacked Christian, wrestling with him and

It should be emphasized. Children—the small ones—often tempt the playmates to disobey their parents or guardians, to do foolishly, or foolish or dangerous things. The teacher can bring them home to them.
 Young men and women, aware of some weakness of some association, will thoughtlessly tempt others, making them feel inferior or refuse to be different from others because of consequences. Help your brother to resist temptation. As Paul says: "It is good neither to eat flesh, nor to drink wine, nor anything whereby thy brother stumbleth, or be offended, or is made weak."
 The fame of the ancient Greek Olympic Games has come to us through the ages. The best of all our international athletic contests are the Olympic Games named after them.
 Paul refers to these athletic contests which were witnessed and followed by the people of that time with as much enthusiasm as we bestow on our modern athletic contests.

throwing him heavily to the ground. The evil spirit thought he had conquered him, but, prone and wounded as he was, Christian managed to grasp his sword and vanquished Apollyon, so that he flew away.
 So St. Paul advises his church members, to "Stand therefore, having your loins girt about with truth, and having on the breastplate of righteousness; and your feet shod with the preparation of the gospel of peace; above all, taking the shield of faith, whereby ye shall be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked."
 "And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God."
 The small boys of a Sunday School class (and many of the girls, too), will enjoy this martial picture of the war-clad hero of old, taking his sword of righteousness to fight the evil of the world. Radio and television stories for children depict strong men riding through the country avenging wrongs, so thus a lesson can be made very vivid for them.
