Picnic Around Your Fireplace

A FIREPLACE PICNIC is perfect for an Indian Summer supper!

Makes these wonderfully delicious stuffed rolls in the morning, wrap them in aluminum foil and refrigerate them until the gang arrives. Then while family and friends are sipping tomato juice, heat the rolls in the oven.

Open some canned beans, season them creatively and heat them on top of the range; turn them into your best bean pot or casserole and top with crisp bacon. With the cheese rolls and beans, bring on corn on the cob—fresh or frozen. For dessert, cookies with milk or coffee and a bowl of fall fruit. Or if your picnic includes teen-agers, you might make dessert an ice-cream soda—their favorite "Black Cow".

Arrange this easy-do supper on a buffet table near your fireplace. Let the gang draw up chairs, help themselves. Good food, good talk and the glow of flickering logs—what's more heart-warming?

BLACK COW

Divide 1 pint of vanilla ice cream among 6 glasses or mugs. Fill slowly with chilled cola beverage. Serve at once. Makes 6 servings.

CHEESE AND HAM STUFFED ROLLS

Ingredients: 2 cups shredded cheddar cheese, 1 cup ground cooked ham, 6 tablespoons mayonnaise or cooked salad dressing, 1/4 cup chopped sweet cucumber pickle, 1 tablespoon finely grated onion, 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce, salt and pepper, 6 to 8 frankfurter rolls, soft butter.

Method: Mix together cheese, ham, mayonnaise, pickle, onion and Worcestershire; season to taste with salt and pepper. Cut slice off the top of each roll; scoop out center. (Dry the scooped-out crumbs and save for use in poultry stuffing.) Spread inside of scooped-out rolls with butter. Fill hollow of each roll with cheese mixture; replace top. Wrap each roll in aluminum foil; refrigerate. Before serving put them in a moderate oven until they are hot through. Serve in wrappers.

Breakfast Dish with Bananas

WE'd like to remind our friends that a good breakfast is just as important during warm weather as it is the rest of the year. Very often, the family plans to be absent from home much of the day, and the knowledge that they go forth fortified with a good meal is of great comfort to the homemaker.

For something substantial to bolster captious eaters, try Banana French Toast or Strawberry Toastwich.

Flavored With Nutmeg

For 4 portions of the banana concoction, combine 2 slightly beaten eggs, 3/4 c. milk and tsp. nutmeg. Dip 8 bread slices into mixture, turning to coat both sides. Brown bread on both sides in 1/4 c. shortening in a skillet.

Slice 3 medium bananas and place a layer of fruit on each of 4 slices of French toast. Cover with second slice of French toast. Serve with maple syrup. To make the toastwich, butter 12 slices bread with 1/4 c. soft butter. Make 6 sandwiches by placing 2 tbsp. strawberry preserves between slices of buttered bread (takes 3/4 reserves in all).

Combine 2 slightly beaten eggs and 1/2 c. milk. Dip each sandwich into egg mixture, coating both sides. Brown sandwiches on both sides in small amount of hot shortening in skillet. Serve at once.

Combine 1/4 c. soft butter and 2 tbsp. prepared mustard and spread on 12 bread slices. Makes 6 balled ham sandwiches.

Combine 2 slightly beaten eggs and 1/2 c. milk. Dip each sandwich into egg mixture, coating both sides. Brown sandwiches on both sides in small amount of hot shortening in skillet. Serve at once.
