| 2 lbs. ground beef | 1/2 cup diced celery |
| 1 lb. ground pork | 1/4 cup diced onions, if desired |
| 2 eggs, unbeaten | 2 heaping tbsps. flour |
| 3 or 4 biscuits, crumbled fine | 1/2 tsp. ground sage |
| 1 1/2 cups tomatoes, fresh or canned, cut fine | Salt and pepper to taste |

Combine all ingredients and mix thoroughly. Form into loaf and place on rack in oven over water. Cook at 400 degrees for thirty minutes, then reduce to 350 degrees and cook until done.
